<sup>4</sup>“Graduates employed in the field” means graduates who report that they are gainfully employed within six months of graduation in a position for which the skills obtained through the education and training provided by the institution are required or provided a significant advantage to the graduate in obtaining the position. For reporting purposes, College of Medical Arts considers this to mean graduates who are working as Certified Nurse Assistants in skilled nursing facilities, for nursing home staffing registries, for home health care agencies, in acute care hospitals or in other health care capacities, or who are working as care providers in an either assisted living/residential care for the elderly, or an intermediate care for the developmentally disabled facility.

<sup>5</sup> Placement Rate is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
